Murray Wards- NO NEED TO VOTE!

Following the December Local Government elections we had a vacant councillor seat in both Greater Murray and Greater Wakool Wards.

During the nomination period in January, we ended up with two candidates nominating:

- Geoff Wise for Greater Murray Ward; and
- Dennis Gleeson for Greater Wakool Ward.

This means both will be elected uncontested and residents in these wards will **not be required to** vote in a by-election.

As the majority of people voted to retain the ward system in the recent referendum, council continues to have representation from 3 councillors in each of the 3 wards.

Our Mobile Library and Service Centre is now out and about on a fortnightly basis. Visiting Murray Downs, Wakool and Tooleybuc our exciting new edition is packed with plenty of books and resources and will help extend the reach of council and library services.

From the Mayor's desk...



The summer period is officially coming to its end and 2022 stretches away in front of us with who-knows-what in store. Two years of living with COVID make us very wary of making any predictions and plans, and those we do make have to be hedged with 'ifs and buts'.

Nonetheless, at Council, we have to make plans. The State Government demands it of us, and it makes good sense anyway. So we have long-term plans to construct, and from these we derive our medium-term plans and short-term plans, as well as yearly budgets.

The most important of these is our Community Strategic Plan (CSP). It's a ten-year look ahead to the key strategic directions we as a community want to pursue, and it is from this plan that all the others take their lead. We have just completed our face-to-face consultations- but there is still time to give us your thoughts via our Your Say platform or even just chatting to one of our staff members. Our aim is to collect big, strategic ideas that will shape our long-term directions and objectives and drive our shorter-term plans and budgets. It's not called a COMMUNITY Strategic Plan for nothing. It is driven by you, the community we serve.

And as we talk about planning, what do you think is the biggest item in our expense column of the Council's accounts? Employee salaries? Road maintenance? Water and sewer costs?

No. It's depreciation. And it reflects the success we have had through building the Council assets via grants and Council investment in our roads, sporting facilities, bridges and so on. Every time we build one of those we have to add an expense to our budget that reflects the expected maintenance cost. It has put our budget into deficit and represents a challenge for us to manage. But looking forward, Council is currently undertaking a review of the value of our assets to make sure they are properly valued (and that the depreciation figure is right), and whether the rates of depreciation are appropriate. It's a big job, but it has to be done to get things right.

Council has to look at ways of offsetting these rising costs, and one of those ways is to generate income over and above those represented by rates, fees and charges. One option is to capitalise on some of our land assets by developing them for residential, business or industrial use, and that will be a focus for this Council in the coming year.

Living with COVID is becoming easier. We hope that will continue, and that the damage it has done to individuals and businesses will continue to decline. In the meantime, we wish you well as this year gets underway, and we continue to return to a semblance of normality.

MUST HAVE: Our new Development and Building Checklists

We understand that lodging a development or building application can at times seem overwhelming and complex.

Lots of questions inevitably pop-up; what documents do I need? How much will it cost? What can I expect during the process?

To help with the application process, our staff have developed a suite of checklists to help you get all the right documentation in order before you lodge an application via the NSW Planning Portal.

Our comprehensive checklists and supporting information sheets will guide you through all the steps and necessary information you need to consider when lodging your application online. These tools will not only ensure you know what to prepare, but will also limit delays in your application being processed as all the right information will be at hand.

ON THE ROAD: Updates on a few of our projectbased road works:

- We're in the initial planning stage of Speewa Road and Hollins Lane widening and reconstruction, with designs currently underway.
- We've been widening the road shoulders on Cunninyeuk Road, with sealing completed in late January.
- The construction of **Gray Street** in Mathoura is progressing well and is on track for completion
- We'll be finalising the sealing of **Gilmoure Road** in Moama over the next couple of months.
- Widening and reconstruction works will soon take place along Barham Road in the Thule area.

- How to address key selection criteria and more!



Cemetery records go digital

New cemetery management software will soon be introduced to assist with management of our 6 operational cemeteries across the area.

Administration of our cemeteries is a huge task undertaken by council staff, so this will significantly tidy up the creation and maintenance of records for the Barham, Mathoura Lawn, Mathoura Pioneer, Moama, Moulamein and Tooleybuc cemeteries.

Over the past few months our consultants have undertaken drone aerial surveying at the sites to create high res images, along with ground surveying to capture GPS coordinates for each grave.

This will provide us with detailed mapping and photography of all known plots whilst consolidating plot data into the new software program.

And what does all this mean?

Once the project implementation period is complete, the cemetery management software will not only help streamline council's cemetery records, but it will also provide the community with real-time access to cemetery information via our website.

Online access to cemetery records will be available in the coming months - so watch this space!

Moama Botanic Gardens progresses

Work on stage five of the gardens is progressing well. Bulk earthworks are complete with rock walls now installed. Path bases are shaped and ready for gravel layer to be laid and ready for soft landscaping to commence. The works will complete the western aspect of the gardens and provide connectivity around the space.

Tooleybuc's Mensforth Park additions complete

We've finished off stage two at Mensforth park, including a new 40m flying fox, footpaths, a "hang out space" and landscaping. The improvements further compliment the extensive upgrades already undertaken to Tooleybuc's riverfront area, with the whole space now looking fresh and inviting!

Picnic Point beach looking 'on-point'

A new beach zone at Picnic Point is now open and was well-utilised over the busy holiday period. We recently completed upgrades to the area which included the creation of a new sand beach north of the newly upgraded boat ramp. With a few little extra tweaks still to be undertaken, the new beach will ensure the influx of tourists is met with attractive surrounds, whilst also ensuring our local residents have facilities they can be proud of!

Final polish at Barham Rec Reserve

We've completed the re-sheeting of the internal roads around the reserve along with the refurbishment of the existing toilet block behind the Lawson Pavilion. This much-needed facelift saw the external walls re-sheeted and painted, new doors, entry screens and internal walls and floors rendered and painted.

If you're a local landholder, be sure to grab a copy of our FREE Weeds Identification Guide!


The guide has been developed in collaboration with NSW Local Land Services and the Biosecurity Teams at Murray River, Edward River and Berrigan Shire Councils.
