What goes in your green lidded bin?



Lawn clippings



Pruned shrubs

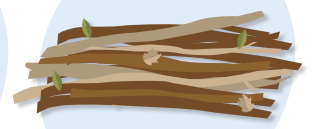


Cut flowers



Weeds

(NOT noxious or priority weeds)



Sticks, twigs and branches

(NO longer than 1m and 75mm in diameter)

Helpful Hints

- 1** NO plastic bags or bin liners, they cause contamination and damage processing equipment.
- 2** Place twigs and branches **AT THE BOTTOM** of the bin to prevent grass clippings from sticking to the bottom.

- 3** Mow your grass as close to collection day as possible and put the clippings **ON TOP** of the pruning or twigs.
- 4** Why not **START YOUR OWN COMPOST** at home? You can use your garden waste, along with paper and food scraps to create a rich fertiliser for your garden!
