Aerosol Cans - which bin?

Empty intact aerosol cans can be safely recycled via the kerbside recycling bin.

Aerosols are used in the bathroom (deodorant, hair spray), kitchen (cooking spray, some cleaning products), laundry, shed (spray paints, WD-40) and garage so remember to recycle them from all over the house.



Aerosol cans are generally made from steel or aluminium, which is infinitely recyclable in Australia.



Butane aerosol cans or canisters such as those used for camping should **NOT** be put in the kerbside recycling, they are highly flammable if any gas is remaining in them. It's best practice to keep them out of the kerbside bin and dispose of them at your local household chemical drop-off service or at one of the Community Recycling Centres or drop off points.
